## IRS Tax Compliance Workshop for NPOs Draws Sell Out Crowd... Accounting for NPOs Set for May 15th

The IRS Office of Exempt Organizations workshop for small and medium sized non profit organizations (NPOs) drew a sell out crowd of more than 75 non profit leaders to the South Jersey Tech Park at Rowan University on March 15th.

The workshop was hosted by the Non Profit Development Center of Southern New Jersey, in cooperation with Rowan University, Seton Hall University, and The Center for Non-Profits. The event was underwritten by PSEG, Archer & Greiner, and the Financial Engineering Institute.

IRS EO Tax Law Specialists addressed the “nuts and bolts” of federal tax-compliance for nonprofit organizations. Topics included:
